

A CHURCH CONSECRATION.

Regular services in Trinity Reformed Church Columbia. A Detailed Account of the Exercises—Efforts on the Part of the Police to Prevent Sunday Bathing—Funeral of Charles Weimer—Notes About Town.

ATTEMPTED HIS LIFE.

Charles Stephan, Cuts Three Gashes in His Three Breasts. He is Recovered. Charles Stephan, residing at 404 Poplar street, attempted to take his life yesterday morning between the hours of 8 and 9 o'clock, by cutting his throat with a razor. He is a peddler by occupation but has been unfortunately in business. His immediate relatives it is supposed unsettled his mind. For several days he has been acting strangely but it was not supposed he contemplated suicide. He got up at an early hour on Sunday morning and walked a distance of a square, wearing only underclothes, to feed his horse. He returned to the house, ate breakfast, and shortly after 8 o'clock went to the garret where he attempted to take his life. He cut three gashes in his throat, and was about cutting another when he was discovered. The woman employed in the house as a nurse for his wife, heard him go up stairs, and suspecting that there was something wrong, went up stairs in time to prevent him from inflicting the fourth wound. She gave an alarm, physicians were summoned, and were successful in saving his life. His wounds were attended to. He lay all of yesterday in a critical condition, and to-day is not much improved. Small hopes are entertained of his recovery. He has been a peddler for a number of years, and is well-known throughout the county.

Blockade on the Port Deposit Railroad.

On Saturday afternoon extra engine 27, on the Columbia & Port Deposit railroad, left Port Deposit with a long train of cars laden with stone. When about two miles south of Port Deposit a portion of the train became loose. After putting out a flagman engine 27 proceeded to Perryville, leaving the detached portion of the train on the main track. Extra engine 21, with a freight train going south, overtook the detached cars, and its engineer supposing he was assisting the train, pushed the cars about a mile further south and then returned to his own train. When engine 27 started back for the balance of its train, it was unable to find the cars where they had been left, it came upon them unexpectedly around a curve near Frenchtown. Engineer Harris saw that collision was inevitable, and after reversing his engine he and conductor Bibby and two others of the crew who were occupying the cab, jumped out and sustained serious injury. The engine plunged into one of the stone cars with such force as to completely wreck it and entirely carry away its front end. The driver of the train, who was on the pilot, and when he saw his danger hurriedly climbed back on the footboard, narrowly escaping. The engine, which was on which he was riding was crushed. The road was blocked by the accident, and passenger trains were delayed and freight business suspended for three hours.
