FRUIT PLENTY AND CHEAP,

The Market Overstocked With Berries and Prices Very Low.

From the New York Times. It has been several years since fruit sold at so low prices as last week. The market was completely overstocked with fruit of fair quality, although there was but a very limited supply of really fine stock. The raspberry growers were sadly disappointed by the results of last week, as this fruit had sold during the earlier part of the season at very profitable prices, and they anticipated little or no change from previous prices. But no people are more easily satisfied at a raspberry feast than New Yorkers, and the season lasted too long and they became surfeited. Thousands of cups of good raspberries of all the varieties from Antwerps to Natives were sold to licensed vendors, jam and syrup makers, or to whomsoever would buy at a cent per cup, or 3 cents per quart, and in many cases for even less price. Thousands many cases for even less price. Thousands of quarts were thrown away. Anticipating a smaller crop and shorter season than usual, nearly every one engaged in preserving, canning, or making syrup bought their supply before last week, and no one wanted any and only bought because they were so very chean.

Blackberries were cheap, and thousands of quarts of perfectly sound berries were whole-saled on each day of last week for as low as 4 cents per quart, and very few could be sold at above 8 cents per quart. There were large shipments of these berries from Delaware, Maryland, and New Jersey during all of last week, and they all arrived in good condi-tion, but the dry weather has caused them to tion, but the dry weather has caused them to be small and present a dried appearance, and there were very few really nice blackberries to be had. There will be a good many rasp-berries here this week, and it is not likely that any will be wholesaled at over 5 cents per cup, and only very fine ones at that, while the greater portion will be wholesaled at about 3 cents per cup. The blackberries that will be here this week will mostly come that will be here this week will mostly come from Monmouth county, N. J., and it is expected that they will be of better quality than any that have been here so far this season. There will, however, be quite a good many from Upper Delaware and Vineland and Hammonton, N. J. The Delaware berries will be of fair quality, but the Vineland and Hammonton berries will be very small and shriveled, and good berries can be had all this week at from 5 to 8 cents per had all this week at from 5 to 8 cents pe

Currants have been searcer this season than in five years, and have been sold at much higher prices. Especially has this been the case with the small currants, such as are generally used for making jelly. The currants are very ripe now, and those housekeepers who intend making their own supply of jelly should not defer in getting them, as they are fast being picked, and after this week it is doubted if any can be obtained. They have been wholesaied all the season at about of cents per pound, and will be wholesaled

about that figure this week.

There will be some very nice Hale's Early peaches here this week. There are a few growers in Delaware and Maryland who know how to cultivate this variety, and where properly reared and all the conditions are suitable to ripen them they sometime mature perfectly, and then they are a very nice peach. This season has been most favor-able so far, hence some fines ones are ex-pected. Toward the last of the week there may be a few Troth's Early from Lower Maryland, and by the first of next week the regular Peninsula peach trains will com-mence to run. That portion of the Peninsula where peaches are the most abundant this season is the lower counties. Consequently the early peaches will be as cheap as be had this season. Peaches will during the first two weeks in August at moderately low prices, but in the latter part of August and the first week of September they will be scarce and high.

The outlook for fruit this week is favorable for consumers. There will be an abundance, and ripe pears, peaches and apples will be cheap, while raspberries and blackberries will be within the reach of almost every one.
