#### AN EQUINE LILLIPUT. The Smallest Horse Living Born in Detroit and

Named for Its Birthplace. From the Detroit Free Press.

On Monday night there was a birth in this city which will find a place in historical records, according to the testimony of more than a score of expert horsemen who are up in equine lore, The birth in question oc curred in Prof. Bartholomew's Equine Paradox car, at the Michigan Central railroad depot, and the parents are respectively Pedro, a Brazilian pony, and La Petite, an East Indian pony. Pedro, the father, is 9 years old and weighs 315 pounds. Although he stands but 45 inches high, he is proportioned like a thoroughbred, and has short, fine hair, with a light cost of mane and tail. In color he is a dark bay, with black points, La Petite, the maternal parent, is an East Indian, of much finer grade of horse than the Shetland pony, and weighs 300 pounds. She is 37 inches high, and from the tip of her nose to the end or "dock" of her tail measures 66 inches. Of the two horses above described, it may be said that there are but very few Brazilian ponies in this country or anywhere else outside of their native country, and they are protected by the Brazilian gov-ernment because of their diminutive, yet perfect, proportions and exceptionally intel-igence and gentle disposition. Of La Petite it is said that horses of her breed are also very rare in this country, and that the East Indian pony is rated among importers as being many points superior to the Shetland product.

the tiny colt born here Monday night should be the dainty gem of equine perfection that it is. The color of La Petile is a very dark gray, while the colt is brown, with black points. Prof. Bartholomew has named the colt Detroit, in honor of its birthplace, and in order that a better estimate may be made of the lilliputian proportions of the youngster, he has furnished the appended comparative table of the measurements of the mother and her offspring: "La Petite." "Detroit." Measurements.

A still better idea may be gained by saying that the length of Detroit's tail—dock and hair—is but 6 inches; that the length of his hair—is but 6 inches; that the length of his face, from poll to mouth, is only 9 inches, and that the total length of the little thing, from shoulder to crupper, is but 17 inches, or 1½ feet. The figures above given are sufficient for believing that Detroit is not only the smallest specimen of the horse ever seen in this country, but that he is as small a horse as was ever born in any country. Last evening he was as lively as a cricket, and gave his proud mother a great deal of anxiety by the proud mother a great deat of anxiety by the familiar manner in which he frolicked about the stable car with a four-weeks'-old puppy the stable car with a four-weeks-old puppy bloodhound which weighs twenty-nine pounds, or six and one-half pounds more than the colt. All day yesterday the car was thronged by horsemen from about the city who looked upon the colt as a marvel in horse history, and La Petite was as dignified and patronizing toward the visitors as the and patronizing toward the visitors as the veriest aristocrat.
