HOUSEKEEPING IN JAPAN. Extract from a Letter from Missionary J. P. Moore. "I have recently moved from my residence in Tsukiji to a palace in the city (Tokio). We are living in a pleasant place, but the house is a Japanese one, and would, I am sure, be a great curiosity to the readers of this. Instead of doors and windows it has on two sides of it sliding doors extending from the floor up almost to the ceiling, which are called 'shojis.' These are divided into small panels about the size of a brick and covered with Japanese white paper, instead of containing glass; so that we live, not in a 'glass house,' but in a 'paper house.' Foreigners, as a rule, substitute the paper doors with glass, in the winter. Running around the house on the sides where the 'shojis' are, is a beautiful verandah, of finely polished wood over which the roof projects some little distance. For protection against weather and burglars too, there are wooden shutters, also sliding, extending up from the outer edge of the verandah. These are closed at night and when stormy, and when closed connect the verandah into a narrow hall extending around the house. Such a house stands in the midst of a garden filled with mountains, flowers and shrubbery is really pretty though very odd. So far we have enjoyed our stay in this house and in the city amongst the people."
