FRUIT CAOPS.

An Abundant Yield of Apples-Prospects fo Pears and Grapes.
The New England Homestead publishes

reports from over 1,000 correspondents in the fruit growing regions of New England, New York, New Jersey, Delaware and England. They show that, although this is the "odd' or non-bearing year for apple trees, there will be no scarcity of that fruit. The crop will fall a little short of 73 per cent, of that of an average bearing year. It is too early for prices on winter apples to be established, but in New England and New York state \$1.50 to \$2.50

England and New York state \$1.50 to \$2.50 per barrel will probably be the ruling prices. There is a great abundance of cider apples, and many will be fed to cattle.

Plums will be a good crop. Pears average about 75 per cent. of a full crop, and the quality of the fruit, generally, is good. Grapes in the East fall below an average crop, but in quality make up for the lack in quantity. Quinces fall below an average crop. Berries and cherries were a great crop, the largest for years.
