The first of those couplets is of two-fold in-

terest. The probabilities are that it is a survival of some habit common to swine in their feral condition, just as we see a dog turn about half a dozen times before lying

down.

In an interesting paper on local weather tore, read by Mr. Amos W. Butter before the American association for the advancement of science during the Philadelphia meeting of 1884, the author has another version of this saying: "When hogs gather upsticks and carry them about, expect cold weather." This is wholly at variance with what I have observed, for my memoranda record this habit almost wholly during the hot weather, and this must necessarily be the rule with New Jersey swine, or the local weather prophets would not have coined the verse as I have given it.

As to the other couplet, it is about as near meaningless as any saying can well be.
