April's Horn and the Growing Crops From the New York Herald.

The weather for several days past has been The weather for several days past has been admirably adapted to advance all forms of vegetation over the United States. The usual "cold period" of April 11-14 has been missed, or has been very indistinct, while the temperature has been more summer-like than vernal in large portions of the country, with a considerable intersprinkling of thunder storms. doubtiess holds true, for when April's horn
(thunder) is heard it is always accompanied
by growing weather, made up of frequent
alternations of hot sunshine and shower.

The time required after planting for Indian
corn to begin germinating is given by the

periods corn, wheat and many vegetables
