- Edith M. Thomas. THE GORGEOUS SUN FLOWER.

A Practical View of the Crowning Blassom of Astheticism.

"J E. W." in Country Gentleman. The sunflower belongs to the composite family, and consists of about fifty species, all American. The annual sunflower, common in our flower gardens, is a native of tropical Americal where it attains awonderful growth sometimes twenty feet high. The stem is thick and rough; the flowers solitary and from one to two leet in diameter, nodding margined by yellow ray flowers, while the central portion, or disk, is crowded with brownish tubular ones; the leaves are heart-shaped and ovate. The plant is now cultivated in nearly all parts of the world, but generally on a small scale; in the south of Europe and in the United States, however, it is sometimes a field crop. The sunflower requires the richest soil. writers have said that it will grow anywhere and in any soil, with little or no attention. My experience has been the opposite. Plant the seeds, when the apple trees bloom, in hills four feet apart each way, and from three to four seeds in a hill, and at last working thin out all the weakest plants but two to a hill. Cultivate the same as cers. Manure highly with good barnyard manure and wood ashes, or any commer-cial fertilizer containing a large percentave of potash. When ready to harvest, the seed-heads may be cut off and hung in sheds until thoroughly dry and ready for thresh-ing. Or they may be left on the field until nearly dry, and cut off and thrown on a wagon, driven along as the cutting proceeds,

threshed immediately; for if the heads are left lying on a heap, they will shortly beat and rot. The seed must be spread out thin on the floor, and should be turned every day or two until thoroughly dry, when it can be run through the grain fan and stored for luture use, as corn or wheat.

The seeds are valued as food for cattle and poultry, and on account of the oil which they contain, which is said to be little inferior to

The seeds are also used, like almonds, for making demulcent and soothing emulsions; and in some parts of Europea bouilli is made of them, which is used as food for infants. The American Indians make bread of them. The American Indians make bread of them. The flowers abound in honey, and are much frequented by bees. The leaves are good fodder for cattle. The stems are used for fuel, and yield much potash. Few plants are so exhaustive of potash—the constituent in which most soils are deficient—as the sunflower; and its cultivation, which of late has been recommended by the agricultural press, for various uses, would soon render tertile for various uses, would soon render fertile soils unproductive. For this reason, it cannot become a profitable farm crop at present

The idea that the sunflower is so called be cause it always presents its face to the sun, is erroneous; the name is more probably due to the resemblance of the flower-head to the old pictorial representations of the sun as a disk surrounded by flaming rays.
