FARM AND GARDEN Some Timely Spring Notes for the Lancaste

From the Germantown Telegraph A practical experimenter advises subject ing potatoes to the light and air after being cut, with the eyes upward until the sprouappears a sensible idea long practiced by some gardeners.

There is frequently much danger to pas ture and meadows by putting live stock upon them too early. All the meadows should be rolled as soon as the frost is out of the ground, to press down all the raised tufts, stones, etc., and secure a smooth surface for the mowing

The first stage of the disease is generally
mild, and will generally yield to careful nutritious diet, such as warm marshes, catmeal,
gruel, suitable clothing and proper ventilation. If the respiration is troubled and the
extremities cold, give a sedative medicine,
rub the legs with dry mustaid, bandage with
ilannel and send for an expert.

Oats and peas sown together make a splendid green feed for hogs, or, when cured
properly, an equally good fodder for sheep
and milch cows. The black-eye marrowfat,
or tanada pea, and some tall, strong stemmed
variety of oats, are the best for this purpose.
One authority advises sowing two and a hait

One authority advises sowing two and a half bushels of oats and one and a-half of peas to the acre, but this is likely too heavy seeding on strong ground. The seed should be covered with a cultivator, or some kind of harrow with big, wide teeth or shovels. Useful Hints for Horse Owners. Horses are very delicate and liable to many ailments, and persons owning them, who are not very familiar with their nature and requirements, will find the following suggestions, condensed from an article in the Cin cinnati Enguirer, useful :

Never feed a horse with hay from a rack-located above his head, as a draught beats down which is injurious, and the dust is liable to injure the eyes.

A horse should not be overworked, for, like man, he gets tired, and to keep in good condition, he should have rest and good

Sometimes a horse will not cat his usual Sometimes a horse will not cat his usual food. A mash of ostineal, milk warm, is about the best food to give a horse under such circumstances. And then a horse should have grass. It is his natural food. A continual diet of hay hardens the coating of his stomach. The food is not digested. Carbonic said was in generated, and the horse bonic acid gas is generated, and the horse dies in agony, swelling up, suffering from what is commonly known as colic. Then, again, horses need well ventilated stables free from draught or damp. The floor should be smooth and nearly level. It should be well drained and light, for a sudden change from darkness to light is trying to the eyes, and a damp offensive odor is injurious

and a damp offensive odor is injurious. Then, again, the bedding and litter should be carefully separated from that which is toul. They should be well shaken up and dried, and the stall should be thoroughly cleansed; and when the stable is empty, let in a pleaty of fresh air.

A horse's stall should be large enough to allow him to lie down comfortably in any position. A tired horse will be glad to lie down with his legs stretched out if he has room; but if you can't give him a loose box, then a light halter block should be used, and care taken to arrange the halter so that it

then a light halter block should be used, and care taken to arrange the halter so that it may travel freely to allow the head to come easily to the litter, for rest and sleep are as necessary as food and water.

If a horse comes to the stable wet, he should be rubbed dry before the blanket is put on. If he is standing about, it should be put on. The legs should be rubbed, and the hoofs always examined for stones. Often Better Than Butter.

From the N.Y. Independent. Recently there has been much discussion as to what laws are advisable in respect of oleomargarine. It can no longer be denied that it is a valuable addition to our oily loods For cooking purposes it is often better than butter. When properly made it does not become rancid in summer as soon as good become rancid in summer as soon as good butter does. For many persons it is quite as easily digestible as butter. It can be furnished at nearly one-half of the cost of good butter. The laws to restrain its sale do not emanate from chemists or from health officers, but from those who believe it to be an interference with dairy interests. to be an interference with dairy interests. Close restrictions are placed upon it, for the very purpose of driving it from the market in order to make more room and better prices for butter. But for it the price of good butter the last winter would have gone to seventy-five cents. The working people are greatly concerned in its production. There is no doubt that, if careful methods are applied, it can be made of very superior quality. Indeed, its manufacturers have about as much reason to complain of the imitations of it which are made from poor butter, bene oil, cotton seed, lard, and various other fats and greases, as have the dairymen to complain that one portion of the cow is brought into competition with another. We are watching with much interest the application of this law as recently passed in some of the states, and shall be able to see whether its working is in the interests of fair dealing, of cheap food, and of good health. dealing, of cheap food, and of good health.
