AGRICULTURAL NEWS AND NOTES.

some Things of Interest for Husbandmen Know and Consider The world's product of wheat in 1885 was 2,110,000,000 bushels, the requirements of consumption 2,165,000,000 bushels, presenting

a deficiency of 55,000,000 bushels, drawn from the previous year's surplus of 125,000,-000 bushels. For the supply of the coming year, the crops of Australia, India and South America already harvested are probably about 32,000,000 bushels less than those of last year, while those of the United States promise fully 100,000,000 bushels more than the harvest of 1885. The wheat in the United States on May let last, was 104,000,000 bush-els, against 162,000,000 in 1885. Growing sunflowers are disinfectants and

serve as a preventive of miasmatic fevers. A gentleman, owning property upon a river bank, planted sunflowers extensively and as a result not a case of misamatic fever has oc-curred among his tenants for years, although in his neighborhood that disease prevailed to a great extent. The sunflower in its growth absorbs large quantities of impure gases, teeding very largely through or by means of its large leaves. It absorbs nitrogen more rapidly than other plants, and will evaporate large quantities of water daily.

The General Condition of Live Stock. From the latest report of the department of agriculture at Washington, the condition of horses throughout the country is shown to be good. They have passed the winter and entered the spring in better condition than usual, both in health and desh. In the Western and Northwestern states the condition is reported exceptionally good. Reports relative to cattle show good condi-tion, many of them relatively high condition, in nearly all of the Northern states, from the Atlantic coast to the Missouri river, while it

also ranks high in Nebraska and Dakota. Some New York returns are exceptionally low, though an average condition exists there. The condition in Ohio, Indiana, Michigan, Wisconsin, and Minnesota is high. So much has been said of losses in cattle in Kansas, and some other Western ranges that the and some other Western ranges that the actual percentage of loss to the whole number is extracted. Colorado lost 6 per cent Arizona 5 and Kansas 3, while California. Oregon, and Nevada lost 4 per cent. New Mexico 3, Indian territory 6, Wyoming 4, and Texas 6 per cent of the whole number. Taking the Southern states of Tennessee, Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, Georgia, North and South Carolina, the average for the whole of these states is over 6 age for the whole of these states is over per cent. The total number of cattle is re-ported at 45,510,630 head. Of these 1,633,350 bave died, or an average of 4 per cent for the

bave died, or an average of 4 per cent for the whole country.

The condition of sheep is generally good. The average loss from exposure and disease is 7 per cent. Texas and Arkansas show the greatest losses—13 per cent. The Southern states previously mentioned show losses of from 10 to 13 per cent. The whole loss for the country is 2,533,736 out of an aggregate of 43,321,531 head.

Hogs [are reported generally healthy. Swine in the West are reported in good health and vigorous. The greatest per cent. of loss is in the Southern states, that in Florida reached 25 per cent. Hilmois, Iowa, Missouri, Kansas, and Nebraska have suffered the most severe losses North, the average being nearly 16 per cent. The whole loss out of 16,002,013 swine is 5,802,417 head.
