A DECEMBE OF GEN. MCLELLAN. Mr. Henry F. Keenan Gives a Caustic Per Portrait of Edwin M. Stanton.

To the Editor of the N. Y. World: The Sun printed the other day a letter, long ago given the public, with an implication that the text is news and the purport a blemish on the late Gen. McClellan's memory. The subject matter of this letter—a complaint of Gen. Winfield Scott—has been known to any one who knew anything of the events of the one who knew anything of the events of the last twenty years and the letter itself can be found in several not recent publications. What purpose is almed at in disparaging Gen. McClellan's memory I cannot conceive. The letter, however, taken in relation with events at the time to which it refers, does not, as the Sus insunuates, prove the commander of the Army of the Potomac insubordinate nor in any sense unmindful of what was due a junior to a senior officer. The feets—and no one a senior officer. The facts—and no one should know them better than the editor of the Sun—were: When called from his master-ful campaign in Western Virginia to take command of all the forces in the capital Gen.

command of all the forces in the capital Gen. McClellan was cautioned by his predecessor, McDowell, that Gen. Scott's headquarters were filled with spies, who conveyed every order and plan, so soon as hinted, to the rebel commanders. Mr. Lincoin himself cautioned the new general against letting Scott or his headquarters staff know any essential details of his plans, the number of the Union troops, &c. It was therefore by the direct order of the commander-in-chief, the president, that the commander of the army of the Potomac communicated directly with the Potomac communicated directly with Scott's superiors. I do not mean to imply that Gen. Scott was unfaithful, but that he was not trusted by Mr. Lincoln or his advisers was notorious at the time. Gen. McDowell complained bitteriy that all his preparations for the campaign of Bull Run and his expectation of co-operation from Patterson in the Shenandoah Valley were conveyed to Beauregard and Johnston from Scott's headquarters. In a note on the Col. Drake De Kay, published this week, he in-cidentally mentions the same thing and tells how he adopted a special signature to prevent the forging of his name by emissaries of the enemy from and to our lines. It is neither journalism nor history to print single letters of the import of Gen. Scott's or the late E. M. Stanton, who is made to say in the recently published letter that McClelian left the capi-tal unguarded. Stanton was notoriously an untruthful, vindictive marplot. Without a single capacity for the details of war, he set himself in correspondence to criticise in private and cripple in public the operations of the commander who made the triumph of the North possible, without whom the Grants, Shermans, Hancocks, Thomases and Meades would have fought in vain. In any other country in Christendom, such a letter as this recently revived of Stanton would consign the writer to the category of the Arnolds and Wallensteins, for it shows the head of the and Wallensteins, for it shows the head of the war department conspiring against the chief military official of his country while with shameless duplicity professing to uphoid his arms. E. M. Stanton cost the American people two years of war. To him we owe the disasters that befel the Army of the Potomac from May, 1862, down to May, 1861. Upon his shoulders rest the responsibility of Pope's burlesque campaigns and the invasion of the North, that amazed the North every summer after Stanton had succeeded in displacing McClelian. There will be a grotesque reversal of places when the history of those days is told by judicial minds instead of the angry told by judicial minds instead of the angry and uninformed partisans who have thus far tortured facts to make such people as Stanton patriots.
