the front end, which was really made of two folding flaps, barred in securely, was forced open. Bombi was in no hurry to leave his old quarters, however. He lay down where he was and chewed his cud meditatively. Prodding his hide-bound carcass was soon found to be futile and the slower process of coaxing began. Fresh grass, carrots and potatoes were thrown on the floor of the cage, and the daintier morsels were held to Bombi's nose and then quickly drawn back while

bi's nose and then quickly drawn back while the beast budged a 16w inches each time to catch them. The rhinoceros is one of the most suspicious of animals and has a greater

most suspicious of animals and has a greater dread of taking a step in the dark than even the elephant. For half an hour Bounts could not be tempted further than the cage's portal. Then his appetite got the better of him a little and by slow degrees his bulky body crossed the line. While he was eating an especially green and tender pile of grass in one corner of the little iron inclosure, the wooden box in which he crossed the sea was cleverly pulled away and the iron gate slid shut and locked.

Bombi did not notice the clatter, but kept on eating his tender grass. The sea voyage

Bombi, though a sluggish, rather swinish beast, is docile, and looks fairly intelligent. He seems to have a sort of affection for his old keeper, Fritz, who intends to sail for Hamburg to-morrow. Fritz is a genuine German, and resents as a damaging imputation the rumor which was current on Sunday that he is a sun-burned and wily native of Dacca.

Bombi, as the first rhinoceros ever exhibited in Central park, and the largest and handsomest one in America, has eclipsed the elephant, and even the tigress Cleopatra, as a spectacle for the curious. A crowd of naturalists, large and small, passed all day vesterday as near the rhinoceros' cage as Superintendent Conklin's rope barriers would let them. Opinions varied as to his beauty, but there was no dissent when it came to the question of his size, his uncouth head and legs, and ugly appearance gener-

head and legs, and ugly appearance generally. The cage itself is not quite finished. The cement floor is not dried yet, and a temporary cover of boards has been laid over it. There is but one beam across the top, and another will be added in a day or two to

steady the walls. The cage measures 20 by 13 by 8 feet. The bars of iron on the sides are several inches apart and measure half an inch in diameter. As soon as the alterations

inch in diameter. As soon as the alterations are made—by Wednesday probably—the barriers will be taken down and the public will be permitted to gaze at short range at

the new rhinoceros.
