A civil war must then be the inevitable result. No one knows this better than Campbell and his conspirators, and they are prepared for the result. The statehood army has thousands already enrelled. General Hugh J. Campbell is commander-in-chief of the statehood forces, which at prosent consist of two army corps, the Eastern and the Central, L. J. Kanouse being commander of the first and A. C. Mellete of the second, each holding the rank of major general. Huron is recognized as the seat of government and military headquarters, but Yankton and Woonsocket and Watertown are the basis of military supplies. Large amounts of guns and ammunition are already in store at these points. It is now an open secret that the recent extended tour of Governor Pierce and party was to feel the public pulse and ascertain the strength of the Dakota National guards. The Free guards are drilling in the city every night. Adjutant General Free is equipping the Dakota national guards and putting our territorial defense in the best possible condition."

Profits of Cattle Ranches.

Profits of Cattle Ranches In one of the English journals (Agricul-ture,) we find a list of eleven of the chief English companies engaged in raising cattle on the Western plains, from which it does not appear that the anticipation of large profits entertained a few years ago, have been even approximately realized. The most successful on the list, the Prairie company, was organized in Edinburgh about five years ago; it now reports a share capital of £291,055, and owns 124,212 cattle. It paid dividends of 2014 per cent, in 1883, and 10 per cent, each in 1884 and 1885. It reports net average sales per head of steers 3 years and upward, at £24,57 in 1885 against £33,75 in 1884. Of the other ten companies, four paid no dividends last year; one paid four per cent, two paid five, and three paid respectively, 6, 7 and 10 per cent. The aggregate number of cattle owned by the eleven companies was 682,013, and they owned and leased in all 3,319,072 acres of land. Their aggregate capital was £2,314,506, to which is to be added £1,632,584 for debentures and preference stock, making a total of \$3,949,085.
