

Louis Bonsparte, Who Expects t Soon Visit America

The expulsion of the royal and imperial etenders to the throne of France has attracted world-wide attention. The action of the French government has done more to make an accession, either of the Bourbons or the Bonaparte's possible than could have been done in any other way. That the poli cy of expulsion is a short-sighted one can be udged from the fact that when Prince Napoeon took his departure from France on June 24th, a dense crowd of people assembled and cries of "Vive l' Empereur" were heard on every hand. The younger son, Napoleon Louis, being at liberty to live in France, Prince Louis is about to visit America and will land in San Francisco shortly. He was born July 16th, 1854. The parents do not now live together; the prince and his son Victor are said to be scrapegraces of the worst kind, having inherited all the faults of the Bonapartes. Some time ago the ex-Empress Eugenie settled \$12,000 a year upon him, and his Aunt Mathide promised him the same annuity, which makes young Victor absolutely Independent of the old man "Plon-Plon." In 1885 the supporters of Victor issued an election manifesto which declared war against "Republican anarchy," proclaiming no "community with revolutionists" and appealed for the support of all who were opposed to the republic.
