NOTES FOR THE PARMER.

Why Some Parmers do not Succeed and Never Likely to.

From the Germantown Telegraph. In looking over the field of agriculture i is very noticeable that in that as well as in other fields of labor there are those who far of success. A casual observation even is sufficient to discover the reason why. Such farmers having no love for the business are neglectful in their work, and are wanting in industry. They do not feel the necessity for knowledge in sgricultural books, and seldom take an agricultural paper; they keep po pace with modern improvements but are willing to continue old methods; they take no interest in labor that is necessary for the care of implements and tools, leaving the plow in the last plowed field, the horse rake and mower (if they have sufficiently advanced to adopt their use) where last used; they neglect necessary repairs upon buildings and fences and the proper saving of manure and fertilizing material. They have no system in the performance of such labor as they unwillingly submit to, neglect the proper care of animals, allow their fowls to roost upon trees, performing such acts only as are of pressing necessity. With such a condition of things is it any wonder that there are found those who fail of success and are ready to declare that farming "don't pay."

Crop Manures. industry. They do not feel the necessity for

Crop Manures. It is certain that we are becoming better acquainted with the action of manures, and know now how to apply them to special crops with expectation of obtaining the best results. Professor Atwater's views correspond with those we entertain, and they have been formed from experimental observations been formed from experimental observations and researches extending over a quarter of a century. Corn needs little nitrogen beside what it can draw from natural sources, while its yield is largely increased under the influ-ence of mineral fertilizers; the most effective being those in which the chief compo-nent is phosphoric acid, or potash, according to the soil and the season. Potatoes respond uniformly to all the fertilizing ingredients, and they are less able than corn to gather from natural sources. The same appears to be true for turnips. Not enough experi-ments have been made with other crops to justify conclusions concerning them. Practically, the largest average yield for all crops is secured by the use of fertilizers containing all the essential elements of plant-food. Used alone, nitrate of soda is rarely useful, sul phate of lime frequently, muriate of potash very often, and the super-phosphates gen-erally. Soils vary in their capacity for con-veying food to crops, and careful observation and experiment are necessary to determine the needs of a particular soil. French Method of Raising Poultry.

Before artificial incubation came into general use the French adopted a novel method of raising chickens. They selected the best laying hens for the production of the eggs. Then, as a turkey can cover about three times as many eggs as a hen, these were so under a turkey, which can be made to hatch three sets of chickens in a season. But they cannot set and care for chicks at the same time, so caponized fowls are shut up in the dark for a day or so with a few chicks and after a little time they become tractable and will take of as many as twenty-five chicks, proving better nurses and providers than the hen and are better able to defend the chicks.

Evergreens for Wind Breaks. Evergreen screens are particularly valua-ble for surrounding the winter enclosures for cattle and sheep, or for placing on the sides of vards most exposed to winds; and they may be made nearly perfect by planting in double rows. On the broader fields of farms, deciduous trees may be planted in belts three or four rods wide, or in several rows, which will entirely break the force of the wind, and by alternately cutting away one side and then the other, the timber they thus afford will make a handsome source of profit.
