Lieutenant Schwatka sent in his resignation of the post he held in the Third cavairy in 1884, and it was accepted, taking effect on January 31, 1885. In the interim he was granted leave of absence, with permission to go abroad. As his letter of resignation gives no reason for doing so, his later action, that of commanding the expedition to explore Alaska at the solicitation of the New York Times, may be accountable therefor. The New York Times has dispatched this expedition with the special purpose of geographical research and of ascending some of the more noted mountain peaks, among which is Mount St. Elias, designated the king of the American continent. Lieutenant Schwatka was the discoverer in King Williams Land in the Artic seas, of the evidence of the death of Sir John Franklin and his party. He also some few years later sailed twelve hundred miles on a raft on the dangerous Yukon river, and explored the remaining eight hundred miles of that previously unknown stream. The mission on which he is now bound was proposed by the Smithsonian institute who would have furthered it had they been financially able to do so.
