The Milk Traille at the East. From the Country Gentleman

Reports from the milk-shipping sections tributary to Boston, New York, Philadelphia and minor cities, to the New England homestead, show that since April I, the supply has been liberal at rather lower prices than last year. This has been due to a variety of causes. The season has been favorable, the pastures have been kept in good condition, and butter has been low in price; the consuming public, which is better able to buy milk than for a year or two back, has also increased its use of that product. The Philadelphia producers, fowing to systematic organization among Pennsylvania milk farmera, average better returns than those who supply the New York and Boston markets. Whole milk sold on the platform of railroads in Philadelphia during March and April at ic, per quart, and at 3½c. from May 1 to September 1. Deducting from these figures i.e. per quart, for freight, paid by the shipper, the average net price received by farmers for the six months was 3 l.c. per quart. The prices received by farmers for milk delivered at Boston depot per 8½c, per quart can, for the summer of 1886, were 20 to 25c., according to the distance from the city and the anxiety to sell. It is understood that contractors will not pay over 35c, per can of 8½ quarts during the ensuing winter, which is from one to two cents lower than last year. Should these low prices prevail, a good many farmers will quit selling. Some of those who have patronized co-operative creamaries or made butter at home have done better than to sell whole milk. The supply of milk at New York city during the summer has been large, and extreme platform prices were only obtained when quite a portion of the product received was soured by the hot weather. and minor cities, to the New England home stead, show that since April 1, the supply has
