Active Demand For Iron, From the Philadelphia Record Vice President Swank, of the Iron and Steel association, states that the improve ment in the demand for fron noted some weeks ago still continues. He states that this is the most active year that the iron trade has ever known, not excepting the demand which prevailed in 1880. He does not characterize it as a boom, but states that it is a legitimate and healthy demand, indicating that business is in good condition. The greater portion of the product is absorbed by the railroads in some form or another, and it is stated that with the large amount of railroad building yet to be done there is no prospect of the demand falling off very soon. This healthy condition of the iron trade has served to advance the prices of from from 50 cents to \$1 per ton. Many furnaces are respected to have sold up their product, and the Thomas Iron company is said to have refused orders because it could not furnish the material. It is further stated of the same company that although it has not opened its books for 1887 it has had inquiries for nearly 100,000 tons, while the Crane Iron company is said to have disposed of 12,000 tons for delivery next year, although it refuses to name any future quotations. The iron which the Southern manufacturers at one time sent to this market, under setting the home product, is now only which prevailed in 1880.
