Next Tuesday's Elections.

On Tuesday next, November 2, elections will be held for members of the Fiftieth Congress in thirty-five states, in which 31s members of the lower house will be chosen. The House of Representatives is composed of 325 members, of which seven have already been chosen, viz., four in Maine, two in Vermont and one in Oregon—all Republicans. As the present representatives from these states are Republicans there will be no change in their political representation. The Forty-minth Congress is composed of 184 Democrats and 141 Republicans, so the latter party would have to make a net gain of twenty-two members to secure a majority of one. The best posted Republican politicians do not expect this, and some even do not claim any considerable gain. Seven states—Rhode Island, Oregon Alabama, Arkansas, Vermont, Maine and Georgia—have aiready elected governors this year, of whom four are Democrats and three Republicans. Seventeen states will choose governors next Tuesday. Of these nine have Republican governors viz., Colorado, Connecticut, Kansas, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, New Hampshire and Wisconsin. The eight states having Democratic governors are California, Delaware, Nevada, New Jersey, Ponnsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee and Texas. Besides electing state officers, several states will vote on constitutional amendments.

Purification of Water by Alum.

Peter B. Austin, a well-known pharmacist, has the following to say on an important dietary subject :

A number of experiments were instituted with the view of determining the end reac-tion, or the smallest quantity of alum re-quired for the clarification of different kinds tion, or the smallest quantity of alum required for the clarification of different kinds of water. City water containing an average of impurities was found to require about two grains of alum to the gallon. The alum should be dissolved in a little hot water, and then added to the impure water, and then added to the impure water, and thorougly mixed with it. Complete separation takes place in the course of six or seven hours, which is hastened by adding the alum in excess. This has the disadvantage, however, of leaving the water contaminated with the free alum, or the portion not combined with the impurities, and is objectionable for some purposes. But when the exact amount has been employed the impurities settle in the form of a magma to the bottom, leaving the water perfectly clear and free from any appreciable amount of alum. Potassa alum is the kind of alum employed; being a double sulphate of aluminum and potassium, it breaks up into insoluble basic aluminum sulphate, which precipitates as an insoluble preaks up into insoluble basic adminium sup-phate, which precipitates as an insoluble magura, carzying all the organic impurities with it, and the sulphuric sold set free forms insoluble compounds with the alkaline earths, calcium, etc., mostly always present in waters. According to this reaction the potassium sulphate only remains in solution, and that in almost minute quantities.
