POINTS FOR THE FARMER. Things Which the Wise Agriculturist Will Read and Ponder. From the German-ton Telegraph.

The distinguished French agricultural chemist, M. Boussingault, gives the relative value of oil cakes as food for stock as follows: One pound of oil cake meal is equal to three pounds of corn meal or nine pounds of wheat bran, or ten pounds of timothy or clover hay.

As an addition to manure or compost heaps manure is most excellent, containing, as they do, not only the alkalies of potash, but also much effete and nitrogenous matter, so very fertilizing in their properties.

It has been found that one bushel of ashes is afforded by 2 1/2 cords of wood, and chemical analysis has demonstrated that in 100 pounds of ashes there are contained 10 pounds of potash, worth 50 cents; 67 pounds of lime and magnesia, worth 60 cents; and 5 1/2 pounds of phosphoric acid, worth 20 cents.

When you want to raise a big crop of oats the following year, break up a corn stubble, not more than from three to four inches deep, two weeks before Christmas, and let it lie so until the first week in April, when sow broadcast thereon a bushel and a half of oats to the acre accompanied with some 20 lbs. of superphosphate to the acre, and double shovel the whole in as shallow as possible.
