POINTS FOR THE FARMER.

Things Which the Wiss [Agriculturist Will Read and Ponder. From the Germantown Telegraph.

The distinguished French agricultural chemist, M. Bossingsult, gives the relative value of oil cakes as feed for stock as follows : One pound of oil cake meal is equal to three pounds of corn meal or nine pounds of wheat bran, or ten pounds of timothy or clover hay. Striped sweet potatoes are a novel color

Striped sweet potatoes are a novel color arrangement in agriculture. A farmer planted a crop of early sweets and then a crop of a later variety and different color on an adjoining piece of land. When the late crop was dug the potatoes were found to be striped, part red and part yellow.

As an addition to manure or compost heaps scapsuds are most excellent, containing, as they do, not only the alkalies of potash, but also much effete and nitrogenous matter, so

also much effete and nitrogenous matter, so very fertilizing in their properties. Indeed, we night safely say that as fertilizers the average scapsuds from the laundry are worth more than the soap from which they

are produced.

It has been found that one bushel of ashes is afforded by 21, cords of wood, and chemical analysis has demonstrated that in 100 pounds of ashes there are contained 16 pounds of potash, worth 89 cents : 47 pounds of lime and magnesis, worth 6 cents, and 515 pounds of phosphoric acid, worth 26 cents. To buy these in the shape of commercial fertilizers would cost \$1.14, making the ashes worth 56

cents a bushel.

If you want to raise a big crop of oats the following year, break up a corn stubble, not more than from three to four inches deep, any time before Christmas, and let lie so until about the last of the following March or the first week in April, when sow broadcast thereon a bushel and a half of oats to the acre accompanied with some 200 pounds of super phosphate to the acre, and double shovel the whole in as shallow as possible. James MacPherson in the Country Gentleman Many of your correspondents abuse these little "critters," I dare say for cause. But they are easily kept under, and they make delicious puddings. A boy who can handle a gun can shoot them by scores, by laying a thin, straight line of grain along the ground, and shooting sparrow shot when they are feeding. But let me tell you something. Along in the fifties ('57 or '58) the English farmers took on the sparrow craze; some man got out a poisoned wheat and they were poisoned by hundreds of thousands. In the next few years there was such a visitation of insect years there was such a visitation of insect pests as the country had never known before; there was hardly a matured gooseberry in the land, for one thing, for the gooseberry caterpillar had dequided every bush of its leaves, and legislation for the protection of the sparrow was loudly talked about, if it was not actually had. There was nothing sentimental about it. As for the talk about the sparrowsiwhipping all the other birds, robins included, I think it is all moonshine. I will tell you what they do—they get up earlier in the morning and probably gobble up the other birds' food; that's how they whip them!

By a dry place is meant one free from dampness, and not simply free from water or mud. Pigs will not do well in a damp atmosphere they soon get a cough and will not thrive. Pure air is a necessary foundation for healthy pigs, and so is cleanliness : dirty pigs never thrive. They should always be clean to keep the pores open and the issues on the inside of the legs, which are organs it will not do to neglect.
