BOSSES TO THE REAR

IP A CITIZER'S TICKET IS PLACED IN THE FIELD NEXT SPAING.

P. Eckert Slaymaker Mentioned for Prothe tary, to Which Office He Was an Efficient Deputy - Other matters of Tuter est in Connection With the Approaching Republican Primary.

The Republican bosses and politicians are not now making any lond efforts to set up townships and secure votes. Whatever is going on is being quietly done, and the leaders are very close-mouthed as to the pro-gross their respective candidates are making. There was quite a commotion in the early part of the week among the bosses when the announcement was made that there would be a third candidate for the nomination of pro thonotary. The gentleman named in connection with the office was P. Rekert Slay-maker. He had filled all the positions in the office from the junior clerkship to the deputyship, and was looked upon as the succ of the present prothonotary. To the surprise of everybody he resigned from the office about a year ago and accepted a responsible position in the Farmer's National bank. It was then said that Mr. Slaymaker would not under any circumstances be a candidate for the office, and the announcement made by parties who pretended to know that he would caused quite a stir in Republican circles. It was admitted that if he entered into the

ontest he would upset the calculations of the bosses, for he is strong with the masses His friends who are supposed to know say that it is not true that he will be a candidate, that he is perfectly well estisfied with his podition in the bank, and that he would not be induced to leave it to go into a contest for

the office.

It may be possible that circumstances may force him into the contest. There is some talk now of getting up a ticket inside up of such names as Slaymaker for prothonotary, Samuel Seldomridge for treasurer, and other responsible business men for the remaining offices to be known as a Citizen's ticket, in opposition to the Hog Ring and Buil Ring selups. It would probably have the support one of the Republican dailies, and with a vigorous effort and canvass of the candidates, would stand a good chance of winning. The people have begun to tire of voting for men set up by the bosses, and as the officers to be selected next spring will be the last men under the fee system, there is a disposition to put men in them who will give their personal attention, and who are pledged to charge no more than the fees prescribed by the act of assembly. smembly. THE OFFICE OF SHERIFF.

Keeper Burkholder has scared them early in the fight, and it looks as if he would be the man that Hippey will have to contest with for that important PRAUDS AT THE PRIMARIES.

It would be a good time for a committee of disinterested Republicans to take hold of the matter and see that there is a fair election and an honest return. Mentzer don't care to take him and Sensenig don't trust him. Mentzer's candidates will be Ben Hershey, of this city, and Al. Worth, of Columbia, brother-in-law of W. F. Beyer. Hershey is expected to look after the Columbia vote through the influence of his brother, who is prominent in politics in that town, and if he is able to accomplish anything it will be to Mentzer's accomplish anything it will be to Mentzer's benefit, for that town has already been re-turned solid against him.

Mentzer and Hartman both think alike on

one point; neither wants a third candidate for the office of prothonotary. Mentzer be-lieves that he can beat Hartman single-handed, but Hartman won't agree with his competitor on that point, and time alone will tell who is the stronger of the two.
