A TRADES PEDERATION FORMED. Outcome of the Convention at Columbus. The Officers Chosen

The Federated Trades met in Columbus Ohio, Saturday morning and adjourned sine die after resolving to enter the new Federated Trades of North America, whose organience the cigarmakers and bakers' labels were adopted, and the action of the boss brewers' convention at Buffalo in regard to blacklist ing union men and the New York Tribune's treatment of union printers were denounced, Local trades unions were urged not to ap-propriate money except on duly authorized

At the afternoon session of the new Trades Federation the resolution was adopted that, while they favored eight hours for a day's work, and believed it would be ultimately adopted, it was first necessary to secure nin hours in all branches now working ten hours and in those trades working more hours to reduce still further. The conference com-mittee that met the Knights of Labor committee submitted a written report purporting to contain what was said and done at Friday's seesion. It said there had been no agree-ment, that the Knights of Labor committee had refused to consider the trades-union treaty, and recommended that the executive council of the newly organized federation issue an address to the public on the sub-ject of the differences between the organi-

The constitution adopted forms a new federation on a simular basis to the Knights of Laber, placing the power of the executive council in the five efficers elected, who are as follows Samuel Compers, of New York, president; George Harris, of Pennsylvania, first vice president; J. W. Smith, of Springfeld, Ill., second vice president; P. J. McGuire, of Philadelphia, secretary, and G. Edimonston of Washington, D. C., treasurer. The president's salary was fixed at \$1,000 and traveling expenses. The new federation adjourned to meet at

Baltimore on the second Tuesday of Dec cember, 1887.
