To day the value of the graded Jersey cattle of Georgia is exceeded only by the herds of New York state. Through his instrumentality there was introthe herds of New York state. Through his instrumentality there was introduced into Georgia the Japanese persimmon, the besagle dog, the Guineacow, which is so well adapted to a profitable existence upon the pine barrens, and his arguments led to the introduction in Atlanta of broom factories, match factories and seep factories. Georgia marble, and Georgia railroads have found in him an enthusiastic eulogizer. And before I forget it I must say a word about his cotton seed arbievement. The Georgia planters threw away their cotton seed as refuse material. Grady, in a series of his convincing articles, showed how a valuable oil could be expressed from the seed and the material that remained could be utilized as a desirable food for cattle. Greetings were exchanged and the test was highly satisfactory. This circuit was 5,830 miles in length, and the test went to show very clearly what the English speaking people of this continent, with their genius and energy, are capable of accomplishing.
