Feeding Cattle.

From the Germantown Telegraph The farmer has to use his best judgmen in the matter of teeding, for the reason that very few are so highly educated as to be able to conduct their feeding upon purely scien tific principles. Science teaches that there is a fixed proportion existing between the albuminoid and carbodydrate principles of feed in the formation of a suitable food ration; where this exists there is a mimimum loss in the ejections from the animal. On the other hand, if this ratio is not maintained between the food elements contained in the classes named, ithere is a loss in that one that

contains the excess. First class hay comes the nearest to a nor-mal ration of any separate food, but in that the time of cutting and the manner of cutting the time of cutting and the manner of cutting might change the character very much. As before stated, the observing farmer will feed judiciously and watch the effect produced, and in such cases it is observable that animals will maintain a good condition throughout the winter. It is not always the quantity even of food that is furnished but the judicious feeding that secures the best results.
