preamble and resolutions, which were unan-mously adopted : WHEREAS, The natural Grainage of the morthern part of the city of Lancaster enters the Consisting creek above the present city water works, thereby polluting the water supply of the city, and in order to avoid the great expense attending the construction of a sour to carry said drainage below our pres-ent water works, we describe to only wise ent water works, we deem it not only and prudent, but also a saving for the tax-payers of the city, to purchase Ranck's mill at fair price and remove the city water works prefore, be in leed. That the water committee recnd to council the purchase of the ommined to council the purchase of the Ranck utili property, water right, etc., now offered for sale, (provided the same can be had at its unriket value,) and the removal of the present say water works tosaid property. *Resolved*, that the chair now request presidents of councils to convens their re-apective bodies on Saturday evening, Jan-uary 15, 1887, and take action on the proposed purchase and removal of present water works. works, The above preamble and resolutions are the outcome of the visit of the finance and water committee to Ranck's mill and the city works on Wednesday last, as noticed in Thursday's INTELLIGENCER. A special meeting of city councils has been called for Saturday evening to consider the above proposition of the water committee. It Is believed that the only practicable way of curing a supply of pure water for the city is to remove the water works up the Conestogs at least as far as Ranek's, and to use the amali stream that rises near Feagleysville and empties into the Conestoga hear Ranck's mill as a sower to drain the northeastern part of the city. This sewerage at present enters the Conestoga above the present water works and much of it is necessarily pumped up into the reservoir that supplies the city with water for drinking, cooking and other purposes.


