

COURT DECISIONS IN COURT.

The Court decides a number of cases argued at the December Term—Current Business. Court met this morning at 10 o'clock for the delivery of opinions of cases argued at the December Term and the transaction of current business.

JUDGE LIVINGSTON'S OPINIONS. Judge Livingston delivered opinions in the following cases: Common law vs. John Hain, lawyer. The defendant was convicted of the larceny of beer bottles and boxes at the last term of court, and his counsel asked for a new trial. The court granted a rule to show cause why a new trial should not be had.

George W. Byrly was convicted of malicious trespass at the adjourned sessions and a new trial was asked for. New trial refused. The exception to the auditor's report in the estate of Ann Long, deceased, were dismissed. One of the exceptions of the auditor's report in the estate of Martin Ringwalt was dismissed, and the report confirmed with directions as to a distribution of the estate.

In the matter of F. A. Diefenderfer, trustee of J. Leno Diefenderfer, the rule for citation was discharged. The rule for new trial in the suit of Straburg, through vs. Jacob Bachman was discharged. In the suit of Levi Senesky vs. Henry B. Barry, the exceptions to probatory a taxation of costs were dismissed, and probatory a taxation was affirmed.

In the estate of Rebecca Benedict, deceased, the exceptions to the auditor's report were dismissed, after making a slight correction as to commissions. In the estate of John Runner, deceased, the citation to Sarah Runner, one of the executors, to file an account and to give security, account to be filed within thirty days and bond given.

The exceptions to the auditor's report, in the estate of John Long, deceased, were dismissed. In the estate of Samuel L. Brubaker, the exceptions to the auditor's report were dismissed, and on the same estate the rule to show cause why confirmation of account should not be opened was made absolute.

In the assigned estate of Henry Kohrer and wife, the exceptions to the auditor's report were dismissed, and the report was confirmed. In the case commonwealth vs. J. F. Johnson, et al., neglect of duty, in which the grand jury indicted the bill and imposed the costs on Abraham Hirsch, the prosecutor, the rule to show cause why so much of the finding of the grand jury imposing such costs should not be stricken off was discharged.

In the matter of the opening of Filbert street, the rule to show cause why the report should not be recommitted to viewers, on petition of Henrietta Kiefer for an appeal granted, the report is recommitted. Another rule to show cause why the report of viewers should not be recommitted was also made absolute.

In the Drummer and Fallon township road, the exceptions to report of viewers were sustained and the report was set aside. The exceptions to the report of viewers in the Penn township road were sustained, and the report was set aside.
