A new ballot-box has just been adopted at one of the recent elections in Paris. The box is square, the four walls of it being of glass. In that respect it does not differ much from the glass boxes used at elections in New York. In both cases the spectators can see the ballot pass into the box. The difference between the New York ballot box and that of Paris is that connected with the latter is a mechanical device which opens and closes the slit at the top of the box as each vote is deposited, while at the same time it registers the number of votes cast. In this way the number of votes cast may be known at any time during the hours of voting and when the polls are closed the register has recorded the total vote, and may be used to verify the official count. Such a self-registering ballot box might be usefully adopted at our own elections. One good result it would certainly have. It would put an end to "padding tickets."
