Such articles, though well meant, have an injurious tendency, as they contribute to the prejudice which still exists against the Jews by bringing up the old thought again that the Jews are money-dealers that they only buy and sell; that they produce nothing, and live of the bonest toil and labor of the remainder of the people. Continuous efforts have been made during the past years to impress upon the com-Continuous efforts have been made during the past years to impress upon the community the fact that we are Jews in religion only, and Americans in everything else. To speak, therefore, of Hebrew merchants and manutacturers, of Hebrew imprehants and manutacturers, of Hebrew imprehants and manutacturers, is but to undo everything which has been done; is to make the Jews an isolated community, separate from their neighbors not only in religion, but in everything else; is to surround them with that exclusiveness which they hoped had diseppeared or would disappear in this land, where they have branched out and become identified with all their surroundings in all directions and have striven manfully to remove that and have striven manfully to remove that hard and exacting exclusiveness. It is dis-couracing and disheartening to see how little this thought has gained foot.

The very fact that Jows have been on this soil over two centuries, that they have lived themselves thoroughly into American ideas and American institutions, should once for all destroy and remove the nation question. and American institutions, should once for all desiroy and remove the nation question. Did they still harbor such thoughts, as they did in the past, that some time in the future they would regain their national independence, and reinhabit Palestine, under the rule of their own king, there was reason for this continual obtrusion in all matters outside of the religious life in which they are concerned. Is there a rogue who steals, and happens to have been born of Jew ish parents, we are informed immediately that N. N., a Hebrew, stole so and so much.
