Trevelyan's Large Majerity.

The Parliamentary election in the Bridgeton division of Glasgow, Scotland, on Tuesday resulted in the return of George C.

day resulted in the return of George O. Trevelyan, Gladetonian Liberal, by a vote of 4,554 against 3,353 for Mr. Ashley, the Conservative candidate. At the last election in this division the Gladetonian vote was 4,364 and the Conservative 3,567.

Mr. Trevelyan in a speech in London said that the Gladetonian victory in the Bridgeton district of Glasgow had made it next to impossible for the government to procisism the National League. The election, he said, had very largely settled the Irish question, and henceforth Iroland must be treated with a policy of kindness, conciliation and condence. The election is felt in Conservative circles to be the heaviest blow the Unionists have yet experienced.

They Refuse to Be Kan Dr. W. H. Saunders, a physician appointed to make examinations of locomotive engito make examinations of icocomotive engineers and other railroad employes under the new state law, which went into effect Monday, abandoned his work at Stevenson, Alabama, on Tuesday, and has run away to Birmingham. He was arrested on a writ of mandamus, which requires him to complete his tests as to color blindness. His reason for abandoning the work is said to be trouble with railroad men, who dislike the new law. All railroad men who operate in Alabama are All railroad men who operate in Alabama are incensed, and call it an outrageous law, many returing to submit to examinations. Over 20,000 men are effected by the law, and it is estimated that over 3,000 will be forced to give up their positions.
