The light and water committee reported the electric lights about as usual. It has been suggested to the committee that fire plugs be placed midway in several squares.

The property committee reported the renewal of fire insurance policy on the opera house.

The finance committee offered a resolution that the tax rate for 1888 be fixed at six mills on every hundred dollars valuation, five mills for general purposes and one mill for sinking fund.

It was decided that council will view alley H below Second, in a body in relation to its bed condition.

The chairman of the highway committee was authorized to fix amount of laborers.

Mr. William Buckner presented a petition relating to an old frame dwelling on South Fourth street, adjoining his property.

Mr. John Kinnebrew requested that Elm street be opened, in order that building operations may be commenced.

Mr. C. W. Bartley called the attention of council to the grade of Alley E, between Second and Third streets.

The Young Men's Christian association asked for a rebate in the rent of the opera house for the Wesleyan Glee club, on April 5th.

A resolution was adopted that a meeting of the citizens be held on Wednesday evening, April 4th, to formulate a programme and devise ways and means for the proper celebration of the centennial of Columbia.

It was decided that the room in the south-west corner of the opera house be set apart solely for the use of council, and the use of any other business is forbidden.

Fifty copies of the ordinance book was ordered to be printed with the new ordinances added.
