

The Red Cross Fair. Last evening the attendance at the Red Cross fair was the largest it has been at any time since the opening. A large number of people were the guests of George H. Thomas, F. O. A. R. and Lancaster County Knights of the Order of the Red Cross. Each of these organizations was escorted from their halls to the fair by the Liberty band, which furnished the music during the evening. A large cake was presented to the fair by Mrs. G. P. Dobbins and another to the band by Mrs. Saltzger. They were afterwards auctioned off for the benefit of the fair. Confectioner Anderson gave two large cakes to the fair, one of which was placed on the Golden Eagle table and the other on that of the Knights of the Order of the Red Cross. A handsome lily was offered off and won by Frederick Snyder. This evening Miss Minnie Goble and Kendig's parlor orchestra will give a concert.

Conclusion of the Soup Fund. At the request of Mayor Morton, Chief of Police Smith made a compilation of the services at the soup house during the past winter, from which it appears the soup house opened December 20, and closed March 17; there were issued during December 1,622 rations; January 5,317 rations; February, 5,451 rations, and March 2,694 rations, making a total for the season of 15,094 rations. The number of families relieved were 15,642.

A detailed statement of the soup fund, which will be published next week, shows that the entire amount of cash contributions to the fund last season was \$309.24, including \$77.76 balance on hand last year; and that the balance in the mayor's hand at present time is \$182.28. In addition to the cash contributions there were many contributions of meat, bread, potatoes, etc., the cash value of which is hard to estimate.

An Orange-Lemon. This morning Charlie Wagner, of the Bureau house, made a queer discovery. He cut a large fine looking lemon in two, and thought that the inside looked like an orange. He and other gentlemen a'co one-half and found that it tasted exactly like an orange and was of the same color, and smell. The outside was light in color like a lemon.
