

AMERICAN CLUB NO. 1.

TENTH CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT OF PENNSYLVANIA UNDER WAY.

Platform of the American Party in Detail and Proceedings of the New Club That Has Been Formed for the Advocacy of Certain Principles.

The American club reassembled in O. U. A. M. hall on Saturday and the meeting was largely attended.

1. That our present system of immigration and naturalization is detrimental to the welfare of the United States, and we pledge ourselves to its restriction and regulation.

2. We demand a continued residence of fourteen years as an indispensable requisite for citizenship.

3. To protect and promote the American free common school system, and we recommend that the several states and territories establish by law a system of free common schools for the universal and enforced education of our children.

4. That the policy of the republic rests largely with her real estate, and any attempt at the destruction of ownership therein is revolutionary and in violation of the guarantees of the constitution.

5. The vast masses of money accumulated in the treasury from the taxation of the people in excess of the necessities of the government, should be released to the people, and we demand a judicious system of internal improvements, and favor the construction of fortifications, and the building of a navy compatible with our position among the nations of the earth.

6. We reassert the American principles of absolute freedom of religious worship and belief; the separation of church and state; and we oppose the appropriation of money or property of the people to any church or institution administered by a church.

7. We recognize the right of women to the same rights as men in all civil and political matters, and we demand the same for the colored race.

8. We demand and advocate a firm and consistent foreign policy, and a vigorous assertion of our national rights in every respect to our flag on land or sea; especially do we demand the assertion and vindication of the rights of our citizens in the North Atlantic ocean; and we view with alarm the aims and purposes of European powers to absorb and control the islands in the North Atlantic and the Pacific oceans; and we demand an emphatic reassertion and a vigorous maintenance of the American doctrine of non-interference with the internal affairs of other nations.

9. The American party recognizes no North, no South, no East, no West in the United States, but one people pledged to our liberty and independence.

Three resolutions were given with a will at the close of the reading of the platform.

There will be two classes of members, active and contributive, and it is expected the club will start with a membership of 125 or 150.
