

YOUNG MAN'S TRAGIC END

CLARENCE PECK INSTANTLY KILLED BY THE RAILROAD.

Correspondence of INTELLIGENCER. LANCASTER, April 24.—Word was received yesterday afternoon of a terrible accident occurring on the Freckville branch of the Philadelphia & Reading railroad, in which Clarence Peck, a well known resident of this place, met his death.

Mr. Peck was on the Reading system Mr. Peck obtained a position as conductor on this road and was considered an excellent railroad man. He was running between Freckville and Palo Alto, and the accident occurred while running on the North Mountain. The train had reached a sharp grade when all trainmen were required to apply the brakes.

Peck was at the brakes, when the rigging broke and the unfortunate man was thrown under the train. Ten cars passed over him, causing instant death and mangled his body in a terrible manner. The remains were brought to town on the 8:20 p. m. train on the Reading road on Monday, and were taken in charge by the order of railway conductors. One of the saddest features of the accident is that he was in town on Sunday spending a few hours with his family and the following day was brought to a funeral in the city.

The charge against the officer was that at the recent Republican primary he went to the Fifth ward and took an active interest in the election while on duty.
