The sentiments of gratitude have been perpetuated amongst us; and some twenty years ago I conceived the idea of giving expression to them in a material form on French soil. I afterward organized a committee of gentlemen for the special purpose of devising the most appropriate way in which to carry out that idea. We however suspended our undertaking in deference to the earnest solicitation of the promoters of the status of "Liberty," which has since been offered to the American people. This work having been accomplished, I believe this to be an opportune time, now that the International exhibition of 1889 is in full preparation, to carry out my former project. in full preparation, to carry out my former

project.

The members of the committee referred to are some of them dead, and others dispersed. Under these circumstances, I offer to creet in Paris, at my own expense, an equestrian statue of Lafayette, in bronze, on a site which may ultimately be agreed

on a life which they distributed by the popular in faster myself with the hope, air, that you as well as the members of the municipal council will accept my offer as a token of my sincere gratitude towards a people, amidst whom I have lived for many years, and from whom my compatriots have at all times received the most cordial hospitality.
