COLUMBIA, Sept. 22.—William H. Peck, a shakeman on the Pennsylvania railroad, died very suddenly at his home here on Friday afternoon.

James Fidler testified that he stopped at the house and inquired if Mr. Peck was in. His wife answered that she was sick and he should come in and see him.

John Widmer testified that Peck came into the bar-room on Thursday about 10 a. m. and he noticed that he was sick.

Rev. H. Miller, of Salisbury, who was called to see the deceased about 6 o'clock Friday morning; asked about sickness and Peck said he had drunk about 15 glasses of whisky during Thursday.

Frederick Wagner sent this bottle to a druggist who stated that if this bottle contained a liquid as the label called for, it was arsenic of potassium, sulphuric acid and water.

Physicians stated that if Peck had drunk of the contents and vomited, the poisonous effects were counteracted and death did not result from the poison.

It seems that the bottle had been placed on a table while cleaning the kitchen and Peck had drunk of the contents in a mistake.

The deceased was born in Altoona and lived here about 15 years. He was a brakeman on the P. & R. for about 19 years.

He was aged 38 years and a wife and six small children survive. The funeral will be held on Monday, the remains to be taken to Paradise for interment.
