

IT WAS A BIG SMASHUP. A FREIGHT TRAIN FLUNG INTO ANOTHER NEAR COLUMBIA.

The engine, tender and several cars thrown from the track—Engineer Henry Gill of Harrisburg, Sustains Very Serious Injuries—Wreckers Clear the Tracks.

COLUMBIA, Oct. 15.—A big wreck occurred on Saturday night on the Pennsylvania railroad one mile east of this place. Freight train drawn by engine No. 1172 was standing on the curve approaching the east yard and the hind end was run into by engine No. 230, in charge of Engineer Henry Gill, of Harrisburg.

The engine was torn completely around and thrown on the south track. The tender was thrown over the embankment about 25 feet. The cabin, three empty and two loaded cars of the former train were badly wrecked. The cabin caught fire from the stove and was totally destroyed.

Engineer Gill was injured about the head and face and received concussion of the brain. Fireman Kohler was bruised by jumping from the engine. The men were brought to the railroad hospital and after receiving attention by Dr. Craig were sent home.

Both main tracks were blocked and passengers were transferred around the wreck. The wreckers left the scene at 11 o'clock and returned at 3:30 p. m., after clearing away all the wreck excepting the tender.

The exact cause is not known and can only be determined when the employees receive a hearing.
