

HOUSE OF QUARTER SESSIONS

TRIALS ARE IMPROVED BY THE MILLER AND BAKER THIEVES.

Go to the Reformatory School But Eichman, And Hois Sent to the Eastern Penitentiary.

Upon the re-assembling of court at 2:30 o'clock on Saturday the hearing of desertion and surety cases was resumed.

John Williams, of Mt. Hope, was charged by John H. Irwin with threatening to bite off his ears and nose.

Taac Zech, who is 70 years old, was charged with deserting and failing to provide for his aged wife.

Samuel Johnson, a colored man, living in Columbia, was charged by Amos E. Slatyer, also colored, with having threatened to kill him.

Bernard Dellinger was charged by his wife with failing to provide for her.

John Sentman, convicted of receiving a turkey, knowing the same to have been stolen, was sentenced to undergo an imprisonment of six months.

Charlotte Clark and her daughter Maggie, convicted of conspiracy to conceal the death of the latter's infant child, were sentenced to the county jail for six months.

Michael Rendler, who pleaded guilty to stealing two chickens, was sentenced to an imprisonment of three months.

William Swarr, Joseph Heiselman and William Stiff, who were convicted of maliciously destroying the property of J. Hiestand Stauffer, of Salunga, were called for sentence.

Edward Eichman, who was convicted of receiving goods stolen from Diller's store, and of being one of the Baker robbers, was next called for sentence.

Harry Doucerty, charged with horse stealing, and who was ordered to stand additional bail, entered security in open court in the sum of \$500 for his appearance at the June adjourned quarter sessions court.

Among the cases to be tried are the suits of Michael Burk against the Columbia rolling mill, for damage to the accidental killing of their son Wm. M. Deen by Harry P. Eichler; Constantine Magrinis and John Spangler vs the Philadelphia & Reading railroad company.
