Shooting Rapids in the Canyons.

G. R. Agassiz, of Boston, a nephew of the late Professor Agassiz, and C. P. Curtia, of Boston, have been at Glenwood Springs, Col., for three weeks. Thursday they embarked in a fifteen foot boat on a trip down the Grand river, through the canyon. All they took atoard were guns, a small values and rubber coats.
