The fight over the Stewart millions is practically at an end. The contestants, it is believed, will have a big slice from the 18,000,000 which Mr. Hilton finally obtained from the \$1,000,000 left him by A. T. ttewart, as they will be satisfied with ne mail amount.

The lawyers are all high-priced men, and will come in for big fees. Joseph H. Choate might be reasonably expected to derive \$150,000 for services actually rendered to his clients in the prosecution of the case, combined with his services to the other side in settling it out of court. This would make the round sum of half a million dollars a fair estimate of the total payments to the distinguished lawyers and in legal exponses on both sides.

Of counsel for the contestants was Roscoe Conkling, who rendered important services in its preparation. He was in attendance when the probate court opened on the 12th day of March, 1888, when the fight may be said to have actually begun. That was the famous "blizzard day," and it was exposure encountered in breasting that storm which cost the great lawyer his life. It will be interesting to note the appraisement of Mr. Conkling's service in this case, according to the settlement arranged between Judge Hilton and the surviving lawyers in it.

Among the other eminent lawyers on that side were Mr. Joseph H. Choate, exJudge William G. Choate, Mr. Michael Devine and Frederick R. Coudert. The most noted lawyers on Judge Hilton's side were ex-Surrogate Rollins, Mr. Elihu Root, ex-Attorney General Leslie W. Russell and Jasper W. Gilbert, ex-judge of the supreme court in Brooklyn.

The litigation in which Mr. Hilton had a vital interest was that brought to set aside the transfer made to him by Mrs. Stewart soon after her husband's death, of all A. T. Stewart's business interests. The property here involved was estimated at \$12,000,000. If Mr. Hilton had lost that suit, with the accumulated interest, he would have been rendered comparatively penniless. That suit was brought by Mrs. Sarah Smith through the firm of Martin & Smith, Mr. Frederick W. Coudert being counsel in the case.
