A BANANA AND PINEAPPLE GLUT.

Five Cargoes and Fifty Carloads of Bananas Received Last Week.

From the Philadelphia Ledger.

It has been either a feast or a famine with bananas in this market this season.

The Baltimore Fruit company and Howes & Co, run lines of fruiting steamers between the banana growing countries and this port, and last week two of the former and three of the latter's steamers arrived, laden with an aggregate of 60,000 bunches, beaides which 50 carloads of 15,000 bunches in all were sent over here from New York, making a grand total of 75,000 bunches of such perismable fruit as bananas, launched on the Philadelphia market in one week, when 15,000 bunches a week are about as many as it can profitably handle.

Jobbers in bananas complain of these spasmodic arrivals, and contend that the two companies could regulate their steamers so as to make the arrivals at proper intervals and by so doing keep, the market steady. It is said that the present oversupply must and will be worked off in a week, and then there will be another interval of scarcity or a dependence on New York until these steamers can make their return trip. To add to the trouble, dealers may that last week was what is known among the trade as "strawberry glut week," a period occurring every year, when there is a very slack demand for bananas and pincapples, owing to the heavy supply of strawberries. For the three grades of bananas the prices on Saturday were \$1.25, 70 cents and 50 cents a bunch.

The pincapple is another fruit in which there is a glut at present, but the oversupply, it is said, comprises the poorest kind mostly, and of a size which, as a dealer said, "after the skin is taken off and the core cut out, leaves but a mouthful of pincapple." Last week nine schooner loads arrived in New York from the Bahamas and 10,000 barrels from Havana, of which this market got its full proportien, as well as several consignments from Baltimore. Prices ranged, on Saturday, from \$1 to \$16
