

SEVERELY INJURED. QUENZER'S FOOT CAUGHT IN A WHEEL OF A CARRIAGE. Falls From the Car and Breaks His Leg in a Two-Place Ice House and a Fireman Hurt.

JUNE 26.—Jacob Quenzer, residing on South Fourth street, met with a sad accident last night on the Reading Railroad on his way home from the LaSalle Springs. He was riding on the front of the car, and was running his feet over the rails. The train had passed over the woods, and Quenzer's foot was caught in the switch of the siding on Yeager's farm. He was pulled from the platform and fell heavily to the tracks. Some of his companions saw him and they jumped from the train to help him, but the tannery, starting back on the railroad to look for Quenzer, had already come to the place where he fell. Quenzer was not to be found, but after a long search he was found on the tracks. He was carried to Yeager's farm house, and later in the night brought to his home. His left leg is broken in two places, and an splinter ran into his right foot and his face was scratched.
