Public Sale of Stray Logs.

A large number of lumbermen attended the public sale of stray logs by the Lumbermen's Exchange at the court house, Williamsport, on Thursday. The logs were sold in sections from Green's dam to Chesapeake Bay. The prices for section 1, from Green's dam to Highspiese, estimated at 14,000,000 feet, were: Pine, \$11.20; hardwood, \$4.00; hemlock, \$2.60, and were paid by J. A. Beeber. Section 2, from Highspire to Columbia, went to Colonel James Corcoran, at \$10 for pine, \$6.50 for hardwood, \$4.25 for hemlock. Section 3, from Columbia to Safe Harbor, was bought by J. Henry Cochran, pine bringing \$6.25, hardwood \$5, and hemlock \$2.65. The other sections went in about the same way. These prices are about half the usual ciling price. The salvage and other expenses are paid by the Lumbermen's Exchange, and the logs will be sawed by the purchasers at convenient points down the purchasers at convenient points down the river. These logs are exclusive of the 100,000 feet that lie between Williamsport and Green's dam, and that will be sawed at Williamsport.
