

The pension office recently granted a claim for pension filed by George Hindson, but only allowed the attorney in the case \$\$ as his fee, notwithstanding he produced an agreement between claimant and himself by which he was to receive \$25. The attorney took an appeal to the assistant secretary of the interior, and in a long opinion, made public on Thurs-day, the assistant secretary over-rules the action of the pension office and allows the full amount contained in the agreement. He says that the reason assigned by the pension office that \$8 was considered an equitable amount as fer, taking into consideration the amount of money received on the certificate (\$8), may comport with an appreciative sense of the client's needs, but it has no recognition in any part of the law bearing upon the agreeself by which he was to receive \$25. 


