His calling of balls and strikes allows him to give the game to either nine when the teams are well matched. Now, my patent will do away with this objectionable feature. It is a propelling machine which will allow the man who stands in the box to throw every ball straight over the plate. He can elevate or lower it so as to throw a ball anywhere between the knee and the waist. The velocity of the ball can be regulated, and the team with the best catcher can throw the swiftest ball. Only three balls will be thrown over the plate, and the batter must strike or run. Of course there will be more balls batted, but this will only require more skillful playing in the field. The game will not then go to the nine whose pitcher can the most befuddle the numpire. My ball-tosser will create a sensation in baseball circles, and I expect to make big money out of it."
