THE WHEAT HARVEST.

Encouraging Reports About the Prospective Crops in the Northwest.

The St. Paul Pioneer Press says: "Southern Minnesots and Dakots are in the midst of the wheat harvesting season, while in the central portion the harvest is getting well under way, and in the northern it is leaping in spots. It will be a week or ten days yet, however, before the harvest is general in the extreme northern counties, including the upper portion of the Red River valley. In the southern tier of the counties of this state and also of South Dakota the wheat is being stacked; in scattered localities threshing has begun. The conditions have been extremely favorable both for the ripening and harvesting of the grain, during the past week, and all the reports that have come to the Pioneer Press from regions where the cutting is general are extremely favorable.

"The grain is turning out fully as well: s was anticipated by the latest previous advices in most localities, and in many instances there has been an even better yield than was counted on. In grain that is still standing, not yet ready for the sickle, the effect of the rains of two and three weeks ago is seen in the plump berries and perfectly filled heads. The rains wrought wonders, and regions which were supposed to have been desolated by drouth are now promising a yield that will be at least worth the reaping.

"The improvement in the prospects has been continued and uninterrupted for the last month, and, allowing for all devastated and short crop regions, the Pioneer Press believes that the wheat crop of the Northwest will exceed rather than fall below its previous estimates. In other words, 80,000,000 bushels of wheat, or more, will be harvested this season. In Minnesota the crop, except in the Red River valley and few Northern counties (and even from these advices are more encouraging than at any time this season, will be fully an average crop.

The relative condition of the crop in different divisions of the Northwest has been so thoroughly reviewed on previous occasions that it is unnecessary to go over the ground again. The improvement that has taken place has been quite general wherever there was any grain to be benefitted."

The Northern Pacific report says: "The way in which the wheat has headed out is generally a surprise to the farmers, for while the straw in many places is very short, the wheat has headed out well with a full, firm berry, and where harvesting has commenced the result shows a better yield than was expected."

Reports along the Little Falls Branch west to Morris, along the Minnesota division, and also along the Fergus Falls branch to Fergus Falls, show that wheat cutting is pretty general, and that the yield is in many cases more than an average. This is particularly true of the Little Falls branch from the main line as far west as Fergus Falls and Wahpeton. In the Red River valley the cool weather experienced for the past week has caused the wheat to ripen slowly, with ample opportunity to fill out well. Harvesting in this district will commence next week. The prospects have been steadily improving for the past three weeks, and it now looks as if a full two-thirds to three-fourths of a crop will be secured. Along the Dakota division and branches it is thought by many that the yield will be better than has been figured on heretofore.
