

Will Come Over to Occupy Chairs in the Catholic University.

They Will Come Over to Occupy Chairs in the Catholic University. Notwithstanding the recent decision of Solicitor of the Treasury Hepburn, ad-verse to the importation of the foreign pro-fessors engaged by Bishop Kesne last winter for the Catholic university at Washington, those gentlemen will come to this country and take the places for which they are intended. The educators in question are the Bev. Dr. Schrader, of the Cologne Seminary, for dogmatic theology : Rev. Dr. Banquition, of the University at Lille, moral theology : Dr. Havernat, of the Appolonari at Rome, holy scriptures; Rev. Dr. Joseph Pohle, of Fulda, philosophy, and Charles War-ren Stoddard, English literature. It will be remembered that after the ren-dering of Mr. Hepbura's opinion the matter was carried before Attorney General Miller, hoping for a reversal of decision, but the attorney general declined to take up the case because it was as yet hypothetical. He would give no opinion, until the arrival in this country of the per-sons referred to. Since that time every-thing has been arranged, it is understood, to the entire satisfaction of the university authorities. 


