A BRIDEGROOM KILLED BY A RIVAL. Swore He'd shoot Whoever Married Sarah Cutler and Kept His Word. A most deliberate and cold-blooded murder occurred in Montpelier, Vt., in the cowardly killing of George Gould, a young farmer, just twenty-four hours married, by his rival.

On Wednesday, at East Montpelier, Gould married Laura Cutler, daughter of the late William Cutler, a wealthy farmer, whose property as only child she had inherited. Ever since the war and up to the time of Cutler's death there had resided with him on the farm one James Sternerman, a veteran of the Thirtieth Regiment, Vermont Volunteers, aged 46 years. He had known Laura from a child and made love to her when she grew up and proposed, but had been refused for a much younger and better looking man. Caswell threatened to kill the man she married, but his attention was paid to this and the pair were wedded amid much rejoicing Wednesday evening.

Thursday morning they set out for the bride's home and as they were on their way door Caswell, who was seated behind him, stepped out with a double-barreled shotgun and fired point-blank at Gould, blowing away the entire lower half of his face. The victim fell to the ground and died in a few moments.

The murderer coolly put up his gun and coming to Montpelier gave himself up, saying he was without friends and wanted to be hanged. He claims that for over a year past he has lived with the bride's husband and would not let any other man take his place. This is, however, not believed by the friends of the young girl, who is prostrated.
