"How do you figure that out?" asked one of the marketmen.

"In the first place," the Jerseyman replied, "Just try the skin of any of your fruit. You will find your apples and peaches and grapes, and all your fruit, for that matter, which is home-grown, with a thicker and tougher skin than you have seen for several years. That is one of the indications. That is the way nature takes care of her products. Last winter apples and other fruits were so thin-skinned and tender that it was hard to gather them without bruising them, if you will remember, and we had an extraordinary mild winter.

Corn is another of nature's signboards. The cars this year are protected by thicker and stronger husks than I have seen before for years, and talking with farmers up in Pennsylvania I find it is the same way. Wheat and rye straw are tougher, hay is wirier and seed pods are better protected than usual. These are old farmers' signs, and they are good ones, because they don't come from any moon-planting superstition, but from actual observation year after year by a class of men whose interests lie in keeping close watch of all of nature's moods."
