"Were the true stery of the work there laid before the world it would rival the account of the heroism of Father Damien, that at present justly excites the admiration of Christendom. The accuracy of your 'correspondent' may be judged from the fact that he gives us four stations instead of six, knowing apparently nothing of Zoar or Ramab. The adherents of our church number not 'nearly 1,200,' but 'nearly 1,300,t- Our missionaries have not the monopoly of trade with the Esquimaux. Whoever chooses to barter or seil, among our converts is free to do so, and American ships do engage in such trade with them. The allegation of 'a form of slavery' I beg leave to characterize as a malicious, or at best a reckless, faisehood. This summer I had the pleasure of meeting in Europe the Rev. Benjamin La Trobe, who last year went on a visit from London to Labrador and thoroughly investigated the work of our missionaries in that country. "Among other things, he reported that the main reasons why trade is at all connected with our purely missionary work are these: First, to preserve the native from being wholly at the mercy of unscrupulous traders, particularly such as would corrupt them with intoxicants, the bane of the inferior race: and, second, to provide them in years of extreme scarcity, when the catch of fish, on which they depend, has been insufficient, with sustenance during the winter at a reasonable and fair rate."
